




## GRADE LEVEL PRAYERS

<b>The Sign of the Cross</b>	<b>PreK / K</b>	In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
<b>Guardian Angel Prayer</b>	<b>PreK / K</b>	Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day, be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.
<b>Grace Before Meals</b>	<b>PreK / K</b>	Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts, which we are about to receive from thy bounty, through Christ our Lord, Amen.
<b>Our Father</b>	<b>K / 1</b>	Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
<b>Hail Mary</b>	<b>K / 1</b>	Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.
<b>Glory Be / Doxology (Rosary)</b>	<b>1</b>	Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
<b>Morning Offering</b>	<b>2</b>	O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, for the salvation of souls, the reparation for sins, the reunion of all Christians, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father this month. Amen.
<b>St. Michael the Archangel</b>	<b>2</b>	St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.
<b>Act of Contrition (from the Rite of Penance)</b>	<b>2</b>	My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.

<b>Act of Contrition</b>	<b>2 (Optional)</b>	O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins because of thy just punishments, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.
<b>The Apostles' Creed</b>	<b>3</b>	I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting Amen.

Be it done unto me according to thy word. (Hail Mary.) V. And the Word was made Flesh. R. And dwelt among us. (Hail Mary) V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.  LET US PRAY. <b>Memorare</b>	5	Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of Virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.
<b>Jesus Prayer</b>	5	Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me, a sinner.
<b>Joyful Mysteries</b>	5	1)The Annunciation; 2)the Visitation; 3) The Nativity; 4) The Presentation in the Temple; 5) The finding of the Child Jesus after three days in the Temple
<b>Luminous Mysteries</b>	6	1) The Baptism of Jesus; 2) The Wedding Feast at Cana; 3) The Proclamation of the Kingdom and the call to Conversion; 4) The Transfiguration; 5) The Institution of the Eucharist
<b>Canticle of Mary (Magnificat)</b>	6	From Evening Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours
<b>Sorrowful Mysteries</b>	7	1) The Agony in the Garden; 2) The Scourging at the Pillar; 3) The Crowning with Thorns; 4) The Carrying of the Cross; 5) The Crucifixion
<b>Canticle of Zachariah (Benedictus)</b>	7	From Morning Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours
<b>Glorious Mysteries</b>	8	1) The Resurrection; 2) The Ascension; 3) The Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost; 4) The Assumption of Mary; 5) The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth
<b>Liturgy of the Hours</b>	8	Daily prayer of the Church, marking the segments of each day and sanctifying each day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using readings and prayer. At times the dialogue is between the individual soul and God; at times the dialogue is between the members of the Church; and at times it is even between the Church and the world. It is the very prayer by which Christ the Mystical Body addresses the Father. Each of the canonical hours includes selections from the Psalms that culminate in a scriptural proclamation. The two most important, prayed by all ordained and consecrated persons, are Morning and Evening Prayer.
